Does it score? Section 18A receipts for qualifying donations*; SED recognition with a 100% black, 100% disabled beneficiary base; employment-equity pipeline opportunities. [B-BBEE verification letter available on request]

Will we see the impact? Quarterly verified reports against agreed deliverables, signed off under the oversight of a CA(SA) Treasurer, plus an annual impact summary formatted for your ESG disclosures.

2. What your partnership powers

Four programmes, one goal: independence on each person's own terms.

Social work at the door - SACSSP-registered social workers on the road three days a week: counselling, wheelchairs, crisis relief. Government subsidy funds the social workers; partners fund the way to the door - vehicles, fuel, the centre, the follow-through.

Families & children - early intervention, caregiver support and the Ukonwaba year-end children's outing.

Advocacy & consumer voice - monthly Consumer Forums in 13 communities electing two members directly onto our Board; quarterly slots on Zibonele FM.

Skills that earn - six work sites: protective workshops, the Du Noon urban garden, sewing groups in Parkwood and Langa, recycling in Bonteheuwel, SETA learnerships citywide.

3. Partnership opportunities

Every partnership is structured: defined deliverables, agreed recognition, quarterly reporting. Investment ranges are indicative and will be confirmed with exact costings in your partnership proposal.

Vehicle Partner	R650,000 - R1.2m per vehicle	A branded wheelchair-accessible vehicle serving 13 communities weekly; vehicle branding, handover event, route reporting
Mobility Partner	R100,000 - R250,000 p.a.	Wheelchairs fitted, repaired and delivered; per-device impact register; consented recipient stories
Employment Partner	R75,000 - R200,000 p.a.	Workshop places, learnerships, work-readiness; graduation events; employment-outcome reporting
Community Support Partner	R50,000 - R150,000 p.a.	A year of social work reach in a named community; community-level reporting
Education Partner	R50,000 - R120,000 p.a.	Early intervention and caregiver training; annual outcomes summary
Accessibility Partner	R40,000 - R100,000	Ramps, accessible facilities, assistive equipment; built assets carry recognition
Annual Event Partner	R25,000 - R80,000 per event	Wheelchair Fun Ride, IDPD (3 Dec), Ukonwaba; title or co-sponsorship with media coverage
Technology Partner	R30,000 - R80,000 or in kind	Computers, connectivity, digital skills; lab naming opportunity
Infrastructure Partner	R100,000+ or in kind	Reable Centre maintenance and upgrades; facility recognition
Corporate Volunteer Partner	Time and skills	Structured team days; volunteer-hours certificates for ESG reporting

4. What your investment delivers

R25,000	Keeps one social worker's community route running for a quarter: fuel, phone, follow-through
R50,000	Funds a workshop site for six months: stipends, materials, supervision
R100,000	Delivers approximately 15 wheelchairs assessed, fitted and maintained
R250,000	Underwrites an entire community for a year - every visit, every intervention, every follow-up

5. ESG & CSI alignment

Social impact: disability inclusion in 13 under-resourced communities - direct, local, verifiable. **SED/CSI:** 100% black beneficiary base; section 18A receipts*; documentation pack provided. **Employment equity:** pipelines of work-ready candidates with disabilities. **Accessibility:** visible, photographable outcomes. **Staff engagement:** structured volunteer days, skills-based volunteering, mentorship and disability-confidence workshops run by people who live it. **Reporting:** quarterly verified reports and an annual summary you can lift into your ESG disclosures.

6. Verify us before you commit

We would rather you checked. Our Transparency & Accountability Hub publishes audited financial statements, NPO and PBO certificates, our constitution, board composition and independent monitoring outcomes. Two signatories on every payment; Finance Committee chaired by a Chartered Accountant; annual IRBA audit.

7. How partnership works

Step 1 - Verify. Review the Transparency Hub and this prospectus with your CSI committee.

Step 2 - One conversation. Meet our CEO and Treasurer to match your objectives to a programme: 021 637 1204, ask for the CEO's office.

Step 3 - Your proposal. Deliverables, recognition, reporting schedule and exact costings - then a simple agreement, and the work begins.
